### **Adjusting the breeding fees by 1/8/2010**

All fees related to breeding and transfers are adjusted per 1/8/2010, based on the then valid foreign exchange buying rate. Membership fees will be adjusted by 1/12/2010.

Please take note of the new fees further in this bulletin.

### **Reminders for the breeding season**

#### **Foals naming this year**

The foaling season is nearly upon us and we would like to remind our breeders to notify details of the foal to the registrar within 2 weeks after foaling. Names have to start with G, H or I for 2010. For foals born after 31 December 2010, the names have to start with J, K or L.

#### **Breeding your mare**

Mare owners who will breed with their mares this season will be sent an invoice for breeding fees. A gallery of foalbook stallions with a breeding permit will be on the website next week. If you are breeding to frozen semen, available stallions will also be listed on the site.

## **Registration of your foal**

After you have notified the ANZFHS of a foal born, the foal needs to be micro chipped when still with its dam, or before it becomes 6 months old whatever comes first. If a foal is still born or has a deformity or medical problem, please notify the registrar as well. The statistics are very important for the research that is being done on problems with the Friesian Breed and how to predict them through DNA testing.

### **The fees are as follows (from 1/8/2010):**

- Registration Fee       \$ 65 (increase \$5)
- Microchip Cost       \$ 20 (unchanged)
- Breeding Fee         \$ 70 (decrease \$ 10)
- Deposit for paper (refundable when a foal is sold or dies) - \$ 85 (no change)
- DNA costs (mainly for Bbook II horses or when a registration is late) \$ 71 per horse, and \$ 45 admin fee. (substantial decrease)
- Transfer – seller fee \$ 35 and purchaser fee \$30. (decrease of \$ 5)
- Protected stable name       \$ 80 (decrease \$ 20)
- Subscription to registered stable name \$ 20 (decrease \$ 5)
- Phryso magazine       \$ 115 (decrease of \$ 35)
- Duplicate paper       \$ 120 (decrease of \$ 30)

You will be invoiced for the fees owed. The forms on the website will be adjusted.

## **ANZFHS Website**

## **Iepe passing away**
